President's Message

Ongoing advice on Gradual Entry

We had a meeting with the employer this week to discuss concerns raised around gradual entry.

It is imperative that an ongoing educational dialogue be happening with students on gradual entry. They are registered students, on the 1701 and need to be receiving an education while on gradual entry. The 1701 is what drives funding into public schools.

The teacher's responsibilities include communicating with families/students and assessing learning for reporting. The teacher can use the stand-alone packages from the employer or create something of their own. The stand-alone packages are not a requirement and teachers are under no obligation to receive or mark these packages. These learning packages will come out every week and will focus on areas of SEL, numeracy, and literacy.

How the educational dialogue looks will vary from class to class. In some classrooms it may look like bringing the student into the room or meeting with the student on Teams to include them in a class activity, in others it might look like a series of phone calls or emails. The essential component will be that the dialogue is occurring so, that there's evidence to support the district inclusion of that student on the 1701 to the ministry. This submission is due September 30th and outlines how many kids are being educated in the district.

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This, in turn, drives education funding. Principals will be looking in on this in advance of Sept 30 and, you will likely be approached about a checklist verification. It may feel like additional work because of the tight deadlines but, it will help preserve teacher jobs for the future.

As another stand-alone item, the district will send out assessment packages about every two weeks for gradual transitions students that teachers can use to assess the child. It will contain a task, a video on how to perform the task and a clear, simple district-style rubric to evaluate the task. Teachers are free to use this to inform evaluation or devise something of their own.

We have heard concerns from some that the package may be too challenging for some students. Student Services in the building can help classroom teachers identify the problem areas. As well, there are gradual transitions case managers attached to approximately 10 sites each, who are there to assist and support. Also access your site admin for questions and support.

Mask Protocol in Schools

The employer has decided to stick with its requirement to wear masks in common areas of schools and we support this. The goalposts keep moving around on recommendations from the BCCDC (BC Centre of Disease Control), and Ministry of Ed and Health. Please continue to model good practices by wearing a mask in common areas, as it helps normalize this behaviour and increases voluntary compliance. Be sensitive to the needs of people that must cross-cohort migrate like TTOCs, Explorations teachers, Student Services, etc. Encourage the use of masks in situations where social distancing cannot be maintained. All these little efforts make a difference in where we go with this pandemic.

Cases

This week, we had our first documented case of COVID in the Coquitlam School District. Many of you will have seen the District's announcement about this. What some may not know is the employer can only release the information that Fraser Health allows them to release. They guide this process. When there is an identified case, Fraser Health comes in, looks at the contact tracing, protocols in place and makes a determination about the risk level to the population around the case, and determines if any quarantine or isolation is required. Then, the next steps are discussed with the employer. The district will always have a meeting with the affected staff, explain what has happened, answer questions as they can and do a blitz cleaning of the school affected. We have witnessed them do this in the very few cases we have had in the community and will continue to encourage and support this action in future situations.

TTOC Health and Safety Checklist

Please try to have only one person from your school bring forms to the CTA to reduce the number of people visiting the


office and remember to wear a mask.
