

President's Message

BCTF and the Labour Relations Board

The BCTF submission to the Labour Relations Board under Section 88 of the Code is up on our web page, behind the portal under Member Resources, COVID 19. Members can see for themselves what the BCTF is going to discuss with the larger employer representatives and government. The basis of the application is concerns around the K-12 Restart Plan, resourcing, health and safety and a number of other things. Teachers are strongly encouraged to take a look at this.

Gradual Entry

The employer has committed to the continuation of gradual entry for students and families whose comfort with returning to school has been developing. Teachers still have the freedom to use the stand-alone packages or work of their own devising. Teachers are not obligated to evaluate the package work. Every two weeks, the employer will provide an evaluation package that is also stand-alone, containing a task, a video on how to do the task and a simple district-style rubric to evaluate the task. Teachers are free to use them for evaluation or to devise something that works better for them, to inform the report card. The report contents will look different for those in school and those on gradual entry, as a result. Support for teachers with kids on gradual entry is available through Learning Services, from the same people that created the packages and evaluation documents.

We continue to troubleshoot and advise members on issues around sanitizing and cleaning in schools. We strongly advise that any questions, concerns or debate around this come to the CDMC or, preferably, the in-site JOHS committee. Site-based solutions are still going to be the best ones, as they are responsive to the unique needs of the building and staff within it. We are happy to continue to advise and consult on any of these situations.

Some Good News

The CTA recently concluded an agreement to suspend all teacher evaluations for this school year. Given the circumstances, we felt it was an undue pressure on teachers already having to change virtually everything they do, to add evaluation to this mix. The CTA is also committed to using this time to modernize the process of evaluation with Human Resources. It's been a long time since the documents and processes had any perusal and they have been the source of a number of complaints by the CTA over the years, as one-size does NOT fit all.

Also, the employer has committed to the suspend the Attendance Promotion and Support Program for this year, again. In a year that will pressurize sick leave due to externally-imposed requirements to stay home while sick, having meetings with the employer on the consequent use of sick leave did not seem fair to the CTA.

You will all have heard by now of the FSA postponement until January. Adding this to the load of a teacher and the systems in schools did not seem fair to the union or, even practically possible, with the new restrictions on cross-cohort migration, sanitization protocols, etc. While we would prefer cancellation, we will take this as a first step.


A big thank you to all of the school based PD Reps who took on the role this year and made time to attend training this week!
