Meeting with Fraser Health and Local Presidents

Government

Now that our election results in BC have led to the new government being sworn in, perhaps we can now get some more action from them than we could when they were in caretaker status, from the point when the election was called. The BCTF did not just sit back and wait for the swearing-in; they have been engaging with government representatives on the same subjects they were dealing with them as before: the COVID response, the situation in BC schools, the management and situation of the economy, etc. Premier Horgan is set to announce his Cabinet Thursday so, by the time you read this, we should see many new faces in Cabinet.

The CTA has had a long-standing agreement with the employer that they will not stand in the way of a teacher wearing PPE in the performance of their work, nor will they stand in the way of a teacher trying to establish a positive, open, mask-wearing culture in the classroom. Now we have the signs from the BCTF, which led to a bit of consternation at first from them, fearing this was going to turn away from the agreement and turn into arguments, directives and making education contingent upon wearing a mask, which we cannot do. We met with the employer earlier this week and allayed their concerns about that. We said the intention is to open discussion, broaden understanding, encourage voluntary compliance and not to vary the existing agreement we had with them. So, feel free to put the signs up in your classroom and open the discussion around maskwearing there, in the spirit and letter of the agreement above.
