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President's Message

Welcome back and Focus for the New Year

So, here we are with our first newsletter after the break. I hope your time away was restful in some way, within the limits of the Covid-imposed restriction on meeting up and sharing time with friends and family. I certainly used a lot of Zoom over the break, myself and I am sure you did the same.

Covid challenges continue to be the main focus for us here, as we see situations that are quite upsetting occurring outside of this school district and we wonder how long it will be before we encounter similar situations here. The BCTF presented a brief to the new Education Minister, Jennifer Whiteside, to bring her up to speed quickly on our issues and the concerns we have, particularly with pandemic teaching and learning. Teri was to meet with her this Friday to continue the discussions already started. It's critical to improve safety practices across the board here with stronger mask mandates, greater transparency in exposure information distribution, density reductions and viable online alternatives. We are pressing locally where we can and continuing to meet with the employer, with Fraser Health and the BCTF to work together on moving our agenda forward. We have been fairly fortunate thus far in Coquitlam and that speaks to our strong commitment to open communication with the employer, advocacy around safe practices in schools and the hard work of site-based committee members to address the school-level presentation of the Covid situation.

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We are certainly hearing from members around the Foundation Skills Assessment and know that the entreaties around doing this test now have not gone unheard, locally and provincially. Teachers have been requesting the opt-out letters agreed to under the protocol agreement with BCPSEA and we have been creating and distributing them. It is quite likely we will hear something officially by the time this newsletter comes out on the fate of this assessment, given the many and obvious problems with administering it under Covid, over and above the objections we normally raise to this test.

FSA TESTS COMING SOON

BCTF has released the latest letters and pamphlets for the FSA campaign. The FSAs will run from Jan. 18 – Feb. 26, 2021.

What are teachers doing? What are we not doing?

Teachers are required to administer the test. That said, teachers do not mark FSA tests.

What about communicating with parents?

You are able to distribute information on FSA testing to parents but should do so following the BCTF/BCPSEA protocol.

Here is what you do:

- Inform your administrator that you plan to send/hand out the pamphlets.
- Use the two BCTF/CTA pamphlets.
- Distribute these pamphlets directly to parents, or If sending pamphlets home via students, all pamphlets must be in sealed envelopes clearly identifying that they are produced and distributed by the CTA.

Her latest book, Teacher Burnout Turnaround, looks at how individual teachers and the profession can work to empower themselves and hopefully overcome the difficulties that lead to burnout.
