President's Message

Half-masting

You may have noticed that the employer lowered flags to half-mast in school and district sites yesterday. The purpose of that was to acknowledge the one-year anniversary of the WHO declaring Covid a pandemic and to honour the many lives lost in the last 12 months. Vaccines are giving us hope for the future here but, that can't erase the experience and loss of the last 12 months.

A Bad Month

February turned out to be the worst month for us locally here, since the beginning of the pandemic. The most exposures, isolations, sickness we have seen thus far. The frustrating major cause was people in the general public making poor decisions socially. In an extraordinary move, Fraser Health put out a social media post that showed a flow chart of how one infected individual in a pub turned into 296 people directly affected by that. I think this action really indicates their frustration with people flouting the Covid safety protocols.

Some highlights of the latest Fraser Health Local President's call with Dr. Zbar. We asked for specific information on the number of educators affected by Covid. Dr. Zbar said releasing that was a provincial decision, a theme you'll see repeated shortly. Dr. Zbar claims they are being more aggressive with contact tracing, due to the variant. This statement was a little short on specifics but, there have been five emergency response teams created, to go out to situations that develop that are extreme. We have not seen them in action here, as we are still relatively well-off, compared to some of our neighbours. We pressed Dr. Zbar on region-specific protocols and latitude for superintendents to go above and beyond the provincial protocols. She responded that was, again, a PHO decision. We found this a little mystifying since Fraser Health is responsible for the circumstances in Fraser Health, just as we are responsible for what happens in our local, not the BCTF. We further pressed her on teacher vaccinations and priority, Dr. Zbar again referred to her provincial colleagues in the Ministry of Health, saying it would have to be their decision to prioritize any group.

The BC Teachers' Council zone elections, conducted by the Ministry of Education–BCTC Elections Office, is underway. Emails will be sent out to all BC Certificate Holders notifying them that the content is posted and that Simply Voting will be contacting them with voting instructions.
