President's Message

Vaccination Good News

Dr. Henry announced Thursday that teachers would be among the candidates for vaccination in April. This is, I think, the summation of months of pressure from the locals, the BCTF and members to get the Health Authorities to recognize our work as front line. Personally, vaccination rollout and timing was the very first point I raised with Fraser Health in our Fraser Health Local President's meeting months ago and we have continued, with other locals, to press the point that teachers need to be treated as front-line, be vaccinated and, earlier than general public. It's nice to go into Spring Break knowing that we are setting up to get our first jab, maybe within it or shortly after we are back to work. Having at least one shot before the end of the year presents a really good additional layer of protection for teachers in classrooms and, it also raises the possibility of a second shot before summer is out, making the teaching force of BC fully vaccinated by the start of the next school year.

District Calendar

Lately, there have been many inquiries about calendar, how the dates of our Spring Break are different than other districts and other concerns, like Easter being linked with Spring Break costing a day off.

The employer and the union agree to a consistent 180 day calendar every year, plus 6 PD days and an Admin Day. The Collective Agreement stipulates that our school year starts after Labour Day and ends on the last Friday in June, unless that Friday falls on the 25th or earlier, which means we go to the 30th. We also have a local agreement for a two-week Spring Break, which adds pressure to the calendar, as does Family Day and, as will the potential Indigenous Day. 180 days is the minimum work year we can do that meets the School Act minutes of instruction and maintains the existing schedule of the school day. In the past, the year varied quite a lot, in some cases as much as 7 days, depending on when it began and ended and where motile holidays like Easter, fell. Balancing the semesters for high school and other internal pressures, like PD Days, also affected calendar planning, and still do. A longer work year is a pay cut in that year because, you're doing more days of work for the same money. It also meant a constant reshuffling of school schedules which wasn't good for kids, teachers or parents.

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There have been (and, will be) years with extra closure days inserted when there are more than 180 instructional days within the bookends of the year. We had a very long summer break this school year, as a result of an early end in June 2020 and a later start in September. Teachers are absolutely working exactly the same amount of time this year as last.

Now, people have been pointing out other district calendars that begin and end on the same or earlier days and asking, "How come they can do it?". What people aren't seeing are the various local Collective Agreement clauses that affect that district's calendar planning. Examples include last-Friday-in-June clauses, prescriptive clauses around when Spring Break must occur, extra supervision minutes before and after school, longer instructional days, fewer PD Days, etc. School districts still have to meet the School Act requirements, in addition to all these pressures. When looked at from a height, things appear similar until all these additional requirements are illuminated.

The union is deeply involved in calendar planning with the district, to ensure a stable, predictable, minimal work year that meets provincial requirements and the language of our Collective Agreement. The government oversees and approves every District Calendar in the province. All partner groups are encouraged to participate in the planning process. The reason Spring Break is a week later than the other metros this year was due to the lack of concern expressed in the survey responses for alignment with other districts and to maintain the contractual 6th PD Day, as an example. We have two more years in this three-year cycle so, planning for the next three years will be starting in that last year of the cycle.

All of us at the CTA wish you a restful Spring Break and hope to see you well-rested and re-invigorated for the close of this very difficult year.
