Others out there in VCH were having vaccination targeted to specific schools or neighbourhoods, which was my nightmare. Vaccine supply remains a serious problem here in BC, for wider vaccination. How important this is, at this time, can't be overstated. We will now have a full vaccinated teaching force by school year start. There is no going back from here. There will be tough times ahead and setbacks but, the march is forward, only, from this point. I can't describe how relieved I am to be able to tell you this today. Thank you for all your efforts in keeping kids and schools safe.
