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President's Message

Layoff and Recall

People affected by layoff and recall were contacted this week by the employer. This necessity for a layoff is quite complex in its determination. I will outline some of the factors here that lead the employer to undertake a layoff. I do not feel it is particularly valuable to talk cut-off years and total numbers here, as the people affected know they are affected and I'd rather focus on supporting them through this difficult process.

One of the main factors is the number of continuing teachers vs. the number of students in the district. The number of continuing teachers changes annually, as teachers convert to continuing throughout the year, as they meet the conditions for conversion at different times. So, the continuing teaching force is increasing throughout the year.

The number of students also can change but, generally stays fairly constant throughout the year. Projecting for next year, it appears the employer will be down 51 students, so, not a massive decline, which is something the employer has faced before but, still, not growth, like Surrey has happening. The geography here and the cost of living limit the amount of local resident growth in the Tri-Cities. That's why the employer has relied so heavily on International Ed revenues to support general education and many specialty programs here.

On that point, Covid has had a devastating impact on International Ed revenues and that is impacting available work, too. A comparison helps here. In 19-20, the budget for International Ed was 34 million dollars. For this year, it was 18 million dollars and for next it is projected at 14 million dollars. Much of what prevented a heavy September surplus this year was the unexpected introduction of Federal and Provincial Covid support monies. The CTA ensured that almost all of that went to protect staffing. These monies will likely not be forthcoming for this year and they would come, even if they did, well after the decisions that need to be made around layoff happen.

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There are many other more minor factors here, like retirement/resignation, how many people are going off on leave or coming back, etc.


The CTA has agreed to a Section 54 process with the employer, as it has done with every previous layoff. Section 54 agreements, under the Labour Code, afford certain other additional rights to teachers in receipt of a layoff. District Principal Nadine Tambellini, will be running a Microsoft Teams meeting on May 11 at 3:30 for laid off teachers. This is one of the items she will cover. I will be there representing the CTA. Know that the CTA will be working vigorously with the employer, starting July 1, to return laid off teachers to employment in the district. I have been through that work with the employer many times now and, I am confident we can move this process towards a successful conclusion for teachers guite swiftly. My heart breaks for teachers who are uprooted by this process and support for them is the number one priority here.

Vaccination Status

Just a brief note here that vaccination status is personal medical information. Obviously, it's a topic of discussion right now, since we were prioritized but, I'd ask that teachers not inquire about each others' status in this regard. People can volunteer information if they want but, I don't think direct questions are needed or helpful.


