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## President's Message

#### **Honouring the Forgotten**

It has been a hard week in the wake of the announcement about the discovery on the site of the Kamloops Indian Residential School. I am very grateful to members who gave me the opportunity to engage with Indigenous Education on responses to this terrible tragedy that would help them. Subsequent to my discussions and permission-seeking, many teachers took individual action to address this with their students. People have been sharing some of their activities and thoughts with me and that is very much appreciated. You will see the efforts of one teacher elsewhere in this newsletter. Indigenous Education produced a short video for teachers in schools, entitled "Honouring the Forgotten" which you will have likely seen by now. If not, your Principal has access to it.

The thing that has awed me is that I have spoken to many Indigenous educators, locally and provincially, over the last few days and all spoke of remembrance but, also, forgiveness, healing and reconciliation. I don't know how you forgive such things and I am awed, as I said, by those words, thoughts and actions.

#### What's a Walk In?

I have received this question several times this week. A walk-in is a solemn gathering outside a building, with an acknowledgement of why we gather, by speech, attire or some other means and, then a walk together into work. It is a strong, visible gesture of support for a cause. The BCTF has been asking members to plan walk-ins at their site in support of Indigenous peoples and their struggle. I do think these things have value but, we must add to them by changing our hearts and minds and the hearts and minds of others, in aid of this cause. The CTA intends to make a donation to the Indian Residential School Survivors Society. The document referred to in the top article identifies a number of Indigenous-led charities anyone can donate to. Resources are flowing from Indigenous Education locally and from the BCTF to help with addressing this issue in classes. It really does feel like we have turned a corner from the long wait since the 94 calls to action from the Truth and Reconciliation Commission, in 2015.
