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## President's Message Vaccine Mandate Update

Disappointingly, the Ministry of Ed leaked a draft document for school districts on doing a vaccine mandate last Friday, in advance of ongoing meetings with the BCTF around mandates. That doesn't exactly scream that the consultation is meaningful or authentic. It speaks to, at best, government fumbling or overreach, probably both.

The document is called "draft" but, it certainly looks pretty polished, with no formatting errors, spelling mistakes, misplaced graphics, etc. that draft documents typically present. The content of the document doesn't inspire confidence, either. It's vacuous, vague, indecisive, non-directive and basically lays out only some matters for consideration, if an employer wants to undertake a mandate...or not. Thus, it isn't really a "roadmap" (as it's called) more a list of suggestions for further thought on vaccine policy.

The employer locally has done a preliminary read of the document but, their historical MO is to be cautious with implementing anything so, they are taking the same approach here. The Superintendent spoke to this at the Board meeting Tuesday and, they see themselves, at best, at the information-gathering stage.

The BCTF held a Town Hall Tuesday night, with a number of expert panelists and chaired by Teri Mooring. One of the things that was pretty clear from the panelists is that the Covid in schools is coming from students, in the main, not staff. So, imposition of a mandate for staff vaccination ignores a vast number of people that are the principal source of transmission. We certainly hope that clear rollout of vaccination for children 5-11 will be coming soon but there are a lot of measures districts could be undertaking that would make schools safer, if they were resourced to do them. For example, the walkback of some of the prescriptions from last year (which hasn't been fully realized yet locally) in favour of a K-12 mask mandate that's difficult to enforce isn't the best (or only) course of action here. The government could more fully fund HVAC upgrades for schools and fund improved school cleaning; that would make a difference. The Health Authorities could take stronger action with an information campaign to combat vaccine misinformation, targeted at areas where this is prevalent; that would make a difference, too.

So, all in all, we are still in a wait-and-see mode here. We are watching the Ministries of Health and Education, the BCTF, the local employer and other stakeholders here.
