President's Message

5 Days' Paid Sick Leave

Recent government announcements of 5 days' paid sick leave for all employees in BC have taken a disappointing turn for TTOCs in BC. One of the frustrations about the Employment Standards Act is that teachers are often excluded from provisions in it. What has happened now is that a ruling has come down that the 5 days' paid leave doesn't apply to TTOCs. The rationale for the decision is that the whole Collective Agreement is looked at in toto and if it exceeds the ESA then it's the Collective Agreement that applies. The Collective Agreement states the 1.5/month provision for contract employees and, nonsensically, this means that TTOCs who are served by the same CA are thus excluded from the 5 days provision in the ESA. TTOCs aren't the only ones negatively affected by this decision. Many casual or part time workers under other Collective Agreements will be similarly affected. This is made extra hard by the fact we can't bargain paid leaves in local bargaining so, we can't even try to fix this with the employer. Only the BCTF can bargain paid leave provisions. I am hopeful that the BCTF will take this up and challenge this with the government, just on the basic unfairness of it.

Local Bargaining Update

We are now close to the point where we conclude local bargaining with the employer. We are finalizing proposals and getting read to sign them off as language. Some important gains were made for members here, although what we can negotiate is severely limited by the split of issues between provincial and local bargaining. It is too much detail to go into here, however, once we sign off on the package, we will determine how to communicate with members and when to do the ratification vote. Last round, we did an independent ratification vote in advance of the provincial vote. We will discuss internally with the EC and the Negotiations Committee about what to do this round.

No Heat in Your School? 🦃 Follow the District Protocol

This is the district protocol when the heat breaks down in schools.1. The employee(s) advise(s) the principal of the temperature issue.2. If the principal is unable to make appropriate temperature adjustments, he/she contacts the Manager of Maintenance for expedited assistance.3. The principal shares information with the staff and the school site based Health and Safety Committee and will also contact the District Health & Safety Officer.

4. The principal contacts the Assistant Superintendent and, if necessary, discusses alternative arrangements, including relocation within the school or to an alternate site, or student dismissal.

This protocol has been in effect since 2005: District staff and school administration are well aware of the process. In the event that several schools simultaneously experience heating difficulties, the district prioritizes its responses depending on the severity of the various situations. For example, a whole building without heat is a higher priority than a wing of a building, etc. The district also gives higher priority to a room without heat versus one with too much heat.

Review AP132 Closure of Schools for Extreme Weather Conditions - Section 6 Deals with school closures due to lack of heat.



You will be amazed at how quickly children learn to love reading.


