President's Message

Functional Closure

The word "functional closure" has been lately introduced to our vocabulary and, similarly, introduced to the employer's lexicon as well. Functional closures can happen for a variety of reasons and the employer is currently discussing the circumstances under which they'd happen and also what that looks like for staff. It could mean remote work, from home or site, it could mean redeployment of staff to neighbouring schools to support them, it could mean a skeleton staff at work to support Essential Service Worker kids. It's up in the air and we hope to acquire greater clarity closer to week's end. I want to reiterate that I think the likelihood of a functional closure situation is still quite low. We got through all of last year, with all the shortages and never even got close to a situation where a functional closure was even contemplated. We all know Omicron is more transmissible and thus, it's a bit of a different circumstance but, if we are as careful as we've proved we can be, I still think an functional closure is pretty unlikely.

N95 Masks

Frustratingly, especially given the statements made by Dr. Bonnie Henry and Minister Whiteside at last week's presser, no additional resources or supplies of masks have been provided to the school district. They have blown through all their resources allocated to this and all donations received last year. Heading into an already tough budget season with obvious consequences if they go over budget too much, there is concern about costs of supplying these masks. Schools are having to use their own budget for this and most are doing that. It looks like we can't rely on help from the government here, so, stay tuned for any announcements about this subject.

PD POWER

Did you know that there is financial support available for credit-granting coursework that you complete? Although the yellow form cannot be used to reimburse anything that gives credit (or certifications), course fee assistance is available through the board office. To be eligible for course fee assistance a teacher must have been on a continuing contract for a minimum of two years and you must submit the application form at least two weeks in advance of the course beginning. Once you've completed the course you submit your proof of completion along with proof tuition payment and can be reimbursed up to half of your tuition only costs to a maximum of \$1000 per year!
