

President's Message

N95 Masks

We were all no doubt relieved to hear the BCTF had secured a donation of 100,000 N95 masks for teachers. Absolutely giving credit where it is due, they have been advocating for the provision of N95s to teachers for a while and this is a tangible result from that. We should receive them shortly and will distribute them equitably. Stay tuned for further announcements regarding masks.

Absences/Shortages

The CTA made agreements with the employer to help mitigate the shortages and high absences we could all see as a significant possibility, near-term. That meant cancelling discretionary leave for the month of January and allowing those off on Personal Leaves of Absence to volunteer to TTOC on their PLOA days. We will be reviewing the Discretionary leave exclusion at month's end, as well as the PLOA volunteerism. It is hoped by that point we are through the worst of this shortage situation. We are trying to mitigate the worst of this but, the last few days have been very high for absences, close to record setting. As of this day, though, it is trending back down again.

Definitely, TTOCs are to be congratulated on going above and beyond to help with this situation. They seem to be sticking with Coquitlam and responding very well to the rapidly changing situation. Similarly, folks that have been redeployed from Learning Services, Indigenous Ed and others have really helped to cover classes, as well. The CTA is very grateful for these members' efforts to make the best of these tough circumstances.

Worksafe and Covid

Teachers are reminded that, if they get sick from Covid, they should be filing a Worksafe claim. Covid is an Industrial Disease and has been for over a year. Sick days or other compensation may come from this and the vast majority of these claims have been approved. The basic premise for adjudication thus far is it is known that there is Covid in schools and it's difficult to rule out contracting Covid from work and so, the claims have been approved on that basis.





PD POWER

There is often some confusion around what qualifies as PD and what does not. The BCTF PD Lens is a good guide when you are trying to decide if something fits under the PD umbrella, should be considered in-service, or isn't PD. All PD should be relevant, autonomous, and responsible. For that PD to be successful and meaningful it needs to be diverse, career-long, funded (supported), and collaborative. With that in mind, working on coursework for a certificate or degree does not fall under PD. However, if you've learned something from that coursework that you then choose to share with colleagues in order to do some collaborative planning, that will be PD. The online structure of our current PD landscape makes some of these elements more challenging, but not impossible. With breakout rooms, the ability to connect with colleagues at your site, and chat features we hope that you will still find ways to connect with your colleagues at your next PD event! - **Meggan Crawford PD Chair**



SD43 Course Fee Assistance Update on Available Funds

The Course Fee Assistance Fund exists to help teachers cover registration costs for credit and non-credit courses of value in their teaching duties in SD43 and will be approved on that basis.

Funds are available from **July 1 to June 30** of each year. Applications must be at the School Board Office **no more than two months and no less than two weeks** prior to the start of the course.

Teachers accessing the fund must have been teaching on a **continuing contract for two years** by the time the course begins.

Funds will be approved on a **first-come, first-served** basis. The criteria and eligibility requirements are outlined in Article F.21.2.c of the collective agreement.

As of January 17, 2022, we have utilized 75% of the available funds for course fee assistance. To avoid disappointment and ensure that financial assistance is available to you, please plan accordingly. At this current usage rate, we anticipate that all funds for the 2021/22 school year will be utilized in the next few months.
