Rapid Tests

All of the first round of rapid tests are now reported to be in schools now. To give credit where it is due, the employer did work hard to divide these up and get them in school mail as quickly as possible. Hopefully, no one actually has to use these and we are getting to a place where fewer people are getting sick.

Discretionary Leaves Prescription

The restriction on discretionary leave applications has now come to an end. The employer, as always, still has the right to adjudicate leave applications but, the numbers of absences are down and, there has been no need for functional closures. Thus, we were able to confirm with the employer this week that leave applications will be considered on a close-to-normal footing. We are still in a pandemic but, people should take heart that the applications will not just be summarily denied any longer.

HEPA Units

A tiny bit of money was allocated to portable HEPA units by the government. The total number procured locally was about 200. These have now been distributed to worst-case scenario situations; old portables, rooms with no ventilation, Skill Dev rooms where more students cannot wear masks, etc. It's far from an ideal or total solution but, it is a small bit of good news and we will take whatever we can get and continue to ask for more.


