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President's Message

Ukraine and Donations

We are now watching week four of the unprincipled war of aggression in Ukraine by Russia's leadership. The CTA stands opposed to wars of aggression by any nation and with the people of Ukraine in their struggle. We are all seeing terrible destruction of people and property in Mariupol, the outskirts of Kyiv and elsewhere in Ukraine. We are seeing hundreds of thousands of people displaced into the west of the country, right out of it into neighbouring countries or around the world to family and friends elsewhere. This is something largely unimaginable to many of us here in North America. We have teachers in our local who are working desperately to help their families and the families of others to escape the war. The CTA wants to aid these efforts in any way it can. We are asking members to donate to recognized aid organizations like the Red Cross, Medicins Sans Frontieres, UNICEF, the United Way or similar, to raise resources to help these displaced persons. The CTA will do what it can to make similar donations as well.

Masks, Restrictions and the Trauma-informed Lens

It seems, based upon the level of communications from the membership to us and to the district, people are adjusting to the changed expectations by the PHO around mask protocols and other restrictions reasonably well. The CTA hopes that this decision is the right one and that we will be able to move ahead here to a more manageable level with COVID, after two very long years. The CTA asks that members continue to be respectful of the choices everyone in the schools make around continuing to wear a mask or not. That solidarity and respect will be instrumental in getting us to the next stage in dealing with this pandemic with our mental health intact. Approaching anything that happens here with a trauma-informed lens can make all the difference in how well we handle the uncertainties presented. How that typically works is starting from the position that what has happened has created trauma, accepting that and being compassionate, individually and systemically. There is far more to the trauma-informed lens and we encourage members to investigate it as a method of looking at classroom and school interactions.


