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President's Message

SD43 Budget (again)

In an effort to keep members informed of the progress towards budget setting by the School District, I will give a little review of where we are at. Last night was the Special Board Meeting to hear public feedback on the budget presented at last Tuesday's Board meeting. Now, obviously, we have concerns with a budget that involves cuts, as it's obvious there is little room in a budget that's 91% staffing to make cuts that don't affect staffing. The Board's proposal to cut 24.4 FTE (Full Time Equivalent) from the teaching side is something people could easily misinterpret, like this: 24.4 FTE out of 2600 teachers doesn't sound so bad....? This misinterpretation comes from conflating bodies with FTE. A cut like this will be many, many more teachers than 24. It's impossible to determine at this point how many, as there are many factors that impact that which have not been determined yet. Setting a budget is the first step in determining what will follow. Staffing allocations, post and fill, leaves in and out, resignations and retirements all impact how that cut operationalizes. Thus, I cannot in good conscience make any predictions here but, it hurts having to contemplate layoffs at all, after two years of protracted psychological distress and anxiety, due to Covid.

We also have concerns that the District is scaling back their PD budget incrementally and we are worried that could affect autonomous, teacher-directed PD. We also expressed concerns with a lack of clarity in aspects of the Special Purpose Fund allocations and why a line item had gone up so markedly. While we received clarity later that some of the funds were from deferred sources, it should have been evident what these line items meant in the presented budget. A concern lingers with deferred funds and what will happen next year when those funds aren't available to cushion any blows or continuation of the services those funds are supporting. We will keep our eye on that, at that time.

The next step in this process is for the next meeting to address any amendments to the budget and pass it. That meeting will be held next Tuesday, on the 26th of April, at 7 pm via Zoom. As always, we encourage members to attend these meetings.




