PD POWER

Even though it's May, it is sort of a 'new year' in the world of PD, at least as far as reimbursement goes. May 1st is the start of a new fiscal year for yellow form reimbursement. This means that it is also a reset for the two completed yellow form reimbursements that each teacher is eligible for between May 1st and April 30th of each year. Remember that the yellow form can be used to reimburse pd on any day, not just workshops that fall on PD days, and you can even receive reimbursement for pd done during winter or spring break or summer! Red Dress Day May 5, 2022

May 5th of each year is the National Day of Awareness for Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls (MMIWG) and is also Red Dress Day. This day is meant to bring awareness to the nearly 1,200 (though likely more) Indigenous

Women and Girls who are missing or who have been murdered.

Red dresses are often hung in trees to symbolize those who are lost and people are asked to wear red to draw attention to this epidemic. The 'art installations' of dresses in trees began with Métis artist Jaime Black (visit their website at The REDress Project – Jaime Black (jaimeblackartist.com)) and has since spread across Canada including both official installations and individuals joining in. In whatever way you join in on Red Dress Day, you are encouraged to share photos on social media using #mmiwg #reddressproject and #reddressday to further increase the attention this important issue receives.
