The ratification vote for the local agreement-in-committee will be by secret ballot using the Simply Voting online platform.

Please be diligent about checking your email, including your junk or spam folders after 11:00 p.m. on Sunday, May 15, 2022 for your personalized voter package. Make sure the BCTF has your current email address as that is where the email will be sent. You can access your profile online on their website bctf.ca

You will receive an email from the British Columbia Teachers' Federation (Local 43 – Coquitlam Teachers' Association) using the address vote@simplyvoting.com.

That email will include a link specific to you as an eligible voter. Once voting officially opens, you just need to click that link and vote. You don't need any other information. The link is already personalized for you.

BCTF Member-at-Large *Call for Nominations*

A resignation has created a vacancy on the BCTF Executive Committee. Therefore, the 2022 Spring RA will be electing a Member-at-Large position for a one-year term, for which any active member of the BCTF in good standing may be nominated.

Nominations must be submitted on the BCTF nomination form in writing and signed by the candidate. The form must include either the names and signature of 10 active members in good standing, or a letter from the local reporting that the nomination was made by a general meeting of the local.

Nominations received by 5:00 p.m. on Wednesday, May 18, 2022, will allow for the Federation to publish the candidates information online for Local Representatives, Local Presidents, and the membership the following week.

Tour the new exhibition, Semá:th Xo:tsa: Sts'ólemeqwelh Sxó:tsa / Great Gramma's Lake and find inspiration from the forms and expressions of the masks created by Stó:lō master carver E'yies'lek Rocky LaRock. In the studio, students will use slab hand- building techniques to create a mini clay mask character of their own. Masks will be glazed and fired. 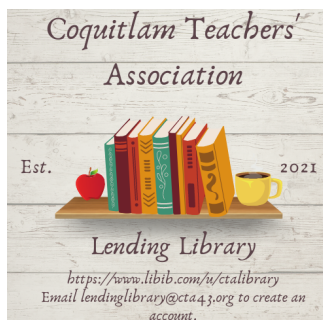
