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# President's Message

# **Capital Funding**

The CTA is concerned with rumours of a capital funding freeze on new schools and potential impacts locally. While we refuse to get into the either/or narrative currently being floated by the Opposition regarding the proposed renovation of the BC Museum, we do have concerns about capital funding uncertainty. These are spurred on particularly this year by the requirement dropped on the school District to find \$25 million over five years to help fund the Burke Mountain High School project. Concerns about a capital freeze also impact best efforts enforcement in the upcoming school year. We are definitely paying attention to this one because, while we are not as much a growth district as our friends in the Fraser Valley, there are areas of growth and needs for new buildings, given the aging infrastructure here.

# **Indigenous Education Honouring Ceremony**

Last night, representatives from the CTA attended the Indigenous Ed Honouring Cermony, held at the Centennial Secondary Theatre. I do recall that the last time I was in that theatre was for this event....back in 2019. It was a distinct pleasure and honour to be asked to witness these graduates completing their educational journey in SD43. The ceremony itself was absolutely lovely, with beautiful carvings on stage, songs and drumming, great speeches from many dignitaries, including Chief Ed Hall, of the kwikwałam (Kwikwetlem) First Nation and two fantastic Si'yam messengers (valedictorians), Sage Eckhart and Tamara Hackett. It was great to have the first of these graduation events attended live in several years be this particular one, considering the journey of healing and reconciliation we are on.


