President's Message

BCTF Education Funding Brief

Last week, the BCTF presented its Education Funding Brief to the Provincial government. This is an annual ritual where the BCTF argues that there are ongoing and systemic inadequacies in education funding. This is not a surprise to anyone who has been around a while in Public Education. It is the eternal struggle.

The first key recommendation in the brief discusses moving away from an austerity planning model, increasing funding to meet the actual, demonstrated needs of classrooms, schools and school districts. Currently, highly prescriptive models of funding exist, like per-student funding, which is always inadequate to meet student and teacher needs.

Another attractive element, literally, is the recommendation to increase recruitment and retention funding. This comes down to the simple fact that there are not as many people choosing this difficult profession as before and it is fairly easy to understand why that is. This is hard work, requires a lot of costly education and has high levels of stress and burnout. Recruitment and retention initiatives are fine but, referring to the point above, the system needs to better support teachers once they've been recruited or retained.

The third recommendation circles back to a previous argument we have had, both locally and provincially. It asks the government to jettison the idea of a prevalence-based funding model. This means, a funding model based on the prevalence of a particular learning challenge in the general population, rather than the actual compositions of a school or classroom. This is highly destructive and that's why we fought so hard to build a coalition of all the partner groups on this a few years ago. This idea has aged like milk since then so, we are certainly not looking forward to a resumption of that fight. We will definitely do, what we have to do but, would prefer improving the existing system to a radical overhaul that would harm kids, parents and teachers.

There are certainly no guarantees that our concerns are heeded but, we must continue to voice them in any available medium. It's the only way to be sure that we have done everything we can to advocate for teachers, kids and families.
