President's Message

Shortages, Failure to Fill 2

Following up on last week's communication regarding failure to fill, the CTA presented a number of items at our Labour Relations meeting with management, to try and help this situation. Several items were agreed to or, at least, interest was shown in them. The employer agreed to allow teachers on personal leave to TTOC on their off time, for this year. They had previously already agreed to top up teachers with p/t continuing contracts in schools, as needs dictate. They also showed interest in a proposal for service recovery we made. They also agreed to part of a data-sharing initiative we proposed. The employer believes they can fill the remaining number of the 15 Permanent TTOC positions they created at the start of the year with the newest round of hires (we will be checking with them on that). Other things they were not interested in and, that is to be expected, in any open dialogue.

There is no magic bullet here. There are significant reasons the situation seems worse this year. The employer had a lot of continuing contract work available after recall was finished and a lot of that work went to TTOCs, reducing the bank. Then, 600 unexpected ELL students showed up and resulted in 25 more teaching positions going out to TTOCs. Then, there was the usual wave of reorganizations and medicals that happens at the start of every year, which generates contract work for TTOCs. Following that, a massive wave of various sicknesses occurred, affecting both contract teachers and TTOCs heavily. The employer can try to hire as many people as possible but, there is a profound teacher shortage, increasing competition and making it a seller's market for almost anyone with certification out there. What happens often is I will hear from someone saying, "It is so much better in X district, they don't have this problem." I will check with the local President and see if they have come up with something we can use here locally. Almost without exception the response is they are suffering heavily with shortages, the same as us. I wish there was something being missed here that would fix this immediately but, it's a systemic problem across the province that we can only somewhat moderate with offerings like those above.




