

Know Your Rights: School Calendar

D.22 (1) Regular Work Year For Teachers (pg. 72) and D.22 (6) Regular Work Year for Adult Educators (pg. 73)

You may be wondering why some years K-12 teachers have a longer summer vacation. This can be explained by Article D.22 (1). All days in session are to be scheduled between the Tuesday after Labour Day and the last Friday in June of the subsequent year. If the last Friday in June falls on or before June 25th, the year will end on June 30th. So if this is applied to this year, the last Friday is on June 23rd, the end date will be June 30th. The other item at play here is that our school calendar will have 180 days of instruction to meet the minimum Ministry requirements for hours of instruction in a year. Article D.22 (6) spells out the regular work year for Adult Educators. Adult Education programs can be offered throughout the year exclusive of Sundays, statutory holidays, and Winter and Spring Breaks. Adult Educators are to be provided with a minimum of two (2) weeks holiday time. The regular work year for Adult Educators shall be 1000 hours scheduled between July 1 and June 30 of the subsequent year. Adult Educators regular work year shall include one (1) Professional **Development Day.**
