### NEWS FROM THE BCTF WINTER REP ASSEMBLY

On January 27-28, 2023, the CTA's Local Reps (Kayleigh MacMillan, Ronak Pahlevanlu, Meggan Crawford, and Amanda Roberts), two alternate Local Reps (Melissa Illing and Ben Whipps), and President Ken Christensen attended the BCTF Representative Assembly (RA). There, representatives elected six delegates (and two alternates) to the Canadian Teachers' Federation AGM coming up in July in Ottawa. The meeting also determined a fee recommendation for debate at the BCTF AGM held at the Hyatt (Vancouver) during Spring Break. The RA doesn't set the fee for the upcoming year, but the AGM does; so, hold on to see what happens with next year's union fees.


The meeting passed creating two new funds within the BCTF's General Operating Fund - emergent expenses and a contingency fund; this is a readjustment of how monies are allocated and not a need for more monies. Additionally, local reps called for a review of the FSA campaign strategy and creation of a new campaign for the upcoming school year. Some further decisions made by this governance body included: increasing per diems for meal allowances, investigating and making recommendations in connection with the Provincial Reporting Order workload, and investigating and making recommendations related to challenges in providing remedy. 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### President's Message

### **Charles Best Gay Straight Alliance Students**

On February 27th, students from the Charles Best Gay Straight Alliance will be making a presentation to City Council regarding flying the Pride Flag during Pride month and for the city to organize a Pride event during that month, in support of the 2SLGBTQIA+ community. I will also be attending the meeting to support these students. We hope that the Councillors and Mayor listen thoughtfully and come to a positive decision.

#### **Budget**

On Tuesday at the Special Public Board Meeting regarding the budget, the CTA and other partner groups made a presentation to ask for changes in the proposed budget. The focus of the CTA presentation was eliminating layoff; systemic underfunding; protecting existing FTE in schools; adding additional FTE in non-enrolling services. We recognize the employer will not be able to meet every request but, there are tangible asks here that could make life better for all teachers.

#### PD Day!

It's the big day on the 24th! Hopefully everyone signed up for their session and is looking forward to the big day. A lot of work has been undertaken to make this day the best it can be. Thank you to Meggan Crawford (PD Chair), the PD Committee, the staff and students at Terry Fox, the Coquitlam Principals and Vice Principals Association, Coquitlam Continuing Education, SD43 and TFEU staff Heidi Davis and Corbey Heyes-Jones.

#### **Long Term Personal Leave vs Part Time Teacher**

As a result of last round of local bargaining, the employer gained more control over Long Term Personal Leave in exchange for added protections for surplus teachers, Continuing Education teachers and Anti-racism language. The compromise arrived at was that the Long Term Personal Leave would be restricted to full year only, instead of allowing partial year leaves. The full year is historically the most requested Long Term Personal Leave. You can still apply under C.23 Part Time Teacher for a leave for term, semester or full year. The deadlines are the same as for Long Term Personal Leave. The practice of self-funding a leave is not affected by this change.

### Know Your Rights: Unpaid Discretionary Leave

### **Article G.5: Unpaid Discretionary Leave (p.109)**

This is a local provision and it is an unpaid leave. A teacher has up to 5 days in a school year to use at their discretion. These days cannot be attached to Winter Break, Spring Break, or Summer Vacation. In addition, there is language that indicates that the leave shall be taken at a mutually agreed to time.

Our advice around Discretionary Leave is to apply for it early, and make sure it is approved before making any travel arrangements.






