## President's Message

### **International Womens' Day**

Today, March 8, 2023, is International Womens' Day. To all the women I've worked with, all the women I've walked picket lines and attended demonstrations with, all the women that have had my back, all the women who've shown kindness and strength in the face of adversity, all the women who've helped me understand, all the women who've made the world just a little bit better for being in it, this day is for you and I wish you the best of this day, on behalf of every member of the CTA.

### **Budget Process**

Work by the Board continues with the preparation of the School District Budget, which will be presented on April 11, 2023. The CTA continues to press home our two main objectives in the budget: the elimination of layoff and increased staffing in school and district-based support areas. We remain confident in achieving something with these goals in the budget and will keep members informed as the process unfolds.

#### **School Visits**

Multiple school visits recently have indicated clearly members are highly engaged on the lack of available support services in schools, whether that be CUPE or CTA staff. The CTA works constantly to address the fundamental reality that there is too little butter for too much bread here. Examples of this are the little additions of staff that go out through the year as they are discovered. Some districts save this up and make their budgeting easier; we don't allow that, as we want all staffing in schools as soon as it becomes available. These little pieces may not always seem like much but, at minimum, it means someone is being compensated now for work that would have been there to be done anyway. School and district staffing is a big part of our advocacy work here and will continue to be a major priority for us.

It's also clear that people are exhausted. While this job is always tiring, it's more than that this year. I do believe Dr. Carrington was on to something when she said at our PD Day that we have the most dysregulated students ever and the most exhausted teaching staff, at the same time. This definitely fits with what members are reporting in school visits, on the phone and in email throughout this year. We do hope to just get to the break here and that there will be some recharging. We want to hear from members struggling with this, as we can offer support and make inquiries with the Board on school circumstances presented to us.




Thank you to everyone who attended the February 24 PD Day: Reconnect 2023!

It was wonderful to feel such positive energy in that space and to meet many of you who I've 'known' through email only over the last few years. The survey is still open and we invite your feedback on the day:

There are often questions around the PD Day budget and how it is used. This year, we were working with a budget of \$45,000 plus some contributions from CCE and CPVPA and an 'income' of \$1,825 from our outside registrants, publishers, and vendors. Speakers, including our amazing keynote Dr. Jody Carrington plus facilitators for ninety-four workshops came in at a cost of just over \$31,500, while coffee, fruit, and cookies was around \$7,000. Additional caretaking staff, TFEU office time, and PD Committee leaves (for setup) totaled approximately \$8,000. Our registration system, Cvent, has a cost of around \$1,700, chair and table rentals came in at \$1,750, and providing food for the awesome Terry Fox leadership students was about \$240. Presenters were provided with a light lunch at a cost of \$2,400 and other miscellaneous costs including hand sanitizer, traffic cones, the band, door prizes, and thank you's to both the Terry Fox staff and the Terry Fox leadership group totaled \$1,800. This budget is shared with the CTA Executive Committee in advance of the PD day and again in the spring once final invoices are settled and we have the exact totals.


