Article G.11 in the Collective Agreement allows for cultural leave for aboriginal employees, using the definition of aboriginal in the Constitution of Canada.

We bring this to the attention of the membership as some other locals have reported difficulties in their members accessing this leave. The leave states it shall not be unreasonably denied. We are clear on the definition of unreasonable.


# **President's Message**

The School District Preliminary Budget has been presented and feedback heard. There is much to like in it, as there are no cuts (a specific CTA request), the employer listened to the input from its stakeholders and altered its approach to budget setting. The employer, for the first time, balanced the tangible costs/risks and the intangible but very real impacts of cost-cutting decisions on our membership. The CTA has been advocating for that with similar arguments for some time now. Leading the news of importance to teachers is the elimination of layoff for the upcoming year and a sustainable plan to continue that into the future. This was the centerpiece of our advocacy around budget this year and it has been accomplished. This connects well with other aspects of additional staffing in the budget, like targeted FTE staffing and blocks at secondary for Indigenous students and students with diverse needs, a minor Dept Head at every Elementary to address Student Services support, the elimination of Principal teaching time across the board, which means more teachers and more ability for Principals to support education in the building. The total added teacher staffing is 25.2 FTE. This meshes well with our requests for additional teaching staff. CUPE also has had one EA at each Middle School raised to a 35 hour position, as well as having 10 EAs added overall. The latter was jointly advocated for by both the CTA and CUPE. The District committed to hiring a District Principal for Diversity and Anti-Racism, which is something needed, as it will allow that to be someone's specific job, not just done off the corner of everyone's desk, as currently occurs.

The School District Budget has been one of the primary responsibilities of the President for many years and, as such, the CTA is focused intensely on budget setting every year. It consumes a great deal of time in advocacy and it's great when that works.
