Sought for bargaining of all conditions of employment in the upcoming contract negotiations (Fall 1982).

NOVEMBER



Took part in the province-wide withdrawal of service as part of action against the legislation and budget. Language agreed to for layoff and recall of teachers



1985

JUNE 5

Attained full bargaining rights at the local level and Instruction Only Program start.

1 day strike against the establishment of College of Teachers; 1 day strike with BC Labour against negative changes to labour legislation.

Principals and VPs leave CTA and BCTF.

1987-1988

Established a Substitute Teachers' Committee.

Approved policy on all schools establishing a Staff Committee.

1991

MAY 29

"Substitute teachers" now referred to as "teacher(s) on call"

SLPs. and audiologists form an LSA within CTA.

Building Acquisition Committee will research purchase of new building.

JUNE 10

1998

2nd Round of provincial bargaining focused on primary class size and staffing ratios for learning specialist teachers.

2003-2004 Adopts new policies regarding the Referendum Vote and CTA Publications.

APRIL-JUNE

BCTF certification sign-up campaign (99% teachers signed up)

All 74 locals chose the "union" model

BCTF engaged in three rounds of local bargaining under the full collective bargaining model

New Policy 45 - Altered School Day; Policy 43 - Job Action; Policy 44 -Secondment

Revisions to Policy 31 - Integration; Policy 42 - Grievances.

Support BCTF on Bill 82 and Year 2000.

1992

JUNE 3

Action plan detailing the 4 phases of strike is authorized.

Collective agreement reached with SD43 is ratified (June 16, 1993).

1995

JUNE 28

CTA votes to purchase the property at 84 Moody Street, Port Moody.

2000

Coquitlam teachers vote in favour of job action.

BCTF affiliates with BC Federation of Labour and CTA affiliates with New West and District Labour Council

Establish a new Social Justice Committee and action research group



BCTF engaged in a two-week strike, deemed illegal by the courts which led to a mediated settlement.

2006

Collective agreement reached between MARCH the government and BCTF (June)

Teaching Profession Act was passed

Collective agreement ratified.

2007 MARCH

The Teachers' Act, Bill 12, was passed in 2011. It dissolved the College of Teachers and established the Teacher Regulation 2011 Branch and the Teachers' Council.
