BCTF GROUP RRSP INFORMATION

One of the benefits of being a BCTF member is the ability to contribute to a group Registered Retirement Savings Plan (RRSP) through payroll deductions. All BCTF members have access to group RRSPs.

BCTF Group RRSPs offer four distinct advantages:

- 1. They allow contributions at source, which is a convenient way to invest.
- 2. No tax is paid on the monies invested, so there is no waiting period for getting the tax deduction.
- 3. Invested funds earn interest throughout the year.
- The plans available to members offer a variety of investment options, including funds not available otherwise.

Pursuant to Article B.5 of the provincial collective agreement, BCTF members in all school districts have access to a group RRSP. The majority of school districts will have access to "the BCTF Plan", which is administered by the Royal Bank of Canada. Employees have the opportunity to enroll or re-enroll in the BCTF Plan:

- a. between September 1 and September 30 or December 15 and January 15 in any school year;
- b. no later than sixty (60) days following the commencement of employment.

A limited number of school districts have access to a group RRSP administered by Sun Life, which was negotiated in 1993.

Once the employee initiates payroll deductions, they are deemed continuous from school year to school year unless the employee requests a change or cancellation, or until the employee is no longer in receipt of pay. Employees are responsible for determining payroll deduction amounts that do not exceed their maximum allowable RRSP contribution limits, as determined by the Canada Revenue Agency. Employees wishing to make additional lump-sum contributions and withdrawals should make arrangements directly with the financial institution administering the plan.

Welcome back to school! As your new Pro-D Chairperson, I'm here to help you explore the many ways that you can engage in Professional Development and grow your teaching practice. For anyone who chose to engage in Professional Development over the summer break, remember to submit your Yellow PD Assistance Forms (for Pro-D events July 1 to Sept. 22) to the CTA office by Fri. Sept. 8th 4:30pm! If you are unfamiliar with the Yellow Forms, ask a colleague at your site or call the CTA office before the deadline. If your PD Rep for this year has not yet been elected and your last year's Rep is available, they can sign summer PD Forms. Note: Courses and/or workshops that provide any credits for post secondary education are not eligible for PD reimbursement. The Course Fee Assistance Fund, administered by the board office, may provide financial assistance. Selecting Site-Based Pro-D Reps – Important Reminder for This Year!

Last year the CTA updated its policy around the selection of PD Rep (and of Staff Rep) and now has clear guidance in CTA Policy 51. PD Reps must be elected by the CTA members at your site.

To elect your site's PD Rep:

1.You will need two colleagues who are not running for the position to send out an email inviting CTA members at your site to put their name forward.

2.Those two people will then run an election by secret paper ballot and share the results with the CTA office (email Kelly – <u>kstewart@cta43.org</u>) no later than September 15. This is an important process to ensure that everyone's voice is included in the selection of this Rep and that everyone has equal opportunity to put their name forward for these positions.

Please start this process ASAP and try to allow several days of voting to provide equitable access for part-time colleagues to participate!

Training sessions for elected PD Reps are planned for the afternoon of Sept 26th & 27th (Reps attend one of these afternoons with release time/TTOC provided).

The PD Rep is the chairperson of your site-based PD Committee and receives training to support their work. These Reps keep PD Committee meetings running, keep an eye on the budget, check/sign reimbursement forms, and help to share opportunities with colleagues. Experience is not needed, and Early Career Teachers are always welcome! Anyone who is interested in this role is encouraged to put their names forward. Every site requires an elected PD Rep for CTA members at your location to access reimbursements from the PD Assistance Fund (to complete the Yellow Forms).
