


## President's Message

## **BCTF Fall Zone Meeting**

Ten members of the CTA attended the BCTF Fall Zone Meeting on October 17-18. At zone meetings, representatives meet with groups in areas including Health & Safety, Bargaining, TTOCs, Aboriginal Education, Social Justice, French, and Professional Development. Read below to see what was discussed in some of the sessions:

#### **Local Presidents**

Presidents talked extensively about many things, including K screeners and their impact, increasing classroom complexity and lack of support. They also talked about the Ministry's latest childcare announcement and, of course, the status of bargaining.

### **Social Justice**

The Social Justice discreet session focused on sharing various ways districts have done SJ work and communications and shared helpful resources. The facilitator stressed the importance of applying for grants to fund SJ work and to ask for assistance from the local if people are unsure of how to complete an application.

#### TTOC

As the TTOC Rep for the CTA, my first-ever BCTF Zone Conference this past weekend was a fascinating and rewarding experience, where I learned a lot from meeting and collaborating with many TTOC Reps from other locals. In our discrete TTOC Reps group, we discussed a wide range of issues, from health and safety for TTOCs, to the pros and cons of the Atrieve call-out system, to the importance of trying to standardize the expectations for all TTOCs as they arrive at each workplace, to finding ways to heighten the profile and recognition of the work that TTOCs do.

### **Professional Development**

An informative couple of days. Locals sharing ideas and Pro-D resources, workshops, and events. In-depth discussions on pragmatic ways to support one another and strengthen our collective practice. Some discussions included teacher autonomy for PD, AI, and Indigenous ways of knowing.

On day one we talked a lot about the BCTF and BC Fed's workshops on health and safety training. Also, we once again spoke about the mandatory training for new and returning health and safety officers.

### FSAs October 1 -November 10

It is that time of year again where we are asked to administer FSAs.
How do we communicate with parents?

You can distribute information on FSAs to parents but need to follow the BCTF/BCPSEA protocol.

### Here is what you do:

- Use the two CTA supplied BCTF pamphlets. (Pamphlets to be shared with parents are the English only version.)
- Distribute these pamphlets directly to parents, or
- If sending pamphlets home via students, all materials/pamphlets must be in sealed envelopes clearly identifying that they are produced and distributed by the CTA and addressed to the parent/guardian.
- Inform your administrator with at least 4 hours notice that you will be sending pamphlets home.

Staff reps and teachers who wish to send information to parents should contact the CTA with the numbers of envelopes and pamphlets that your school requires for distribution.

We have a virtual BCTF Pension Seminar coming up on Tuesday, November 4, from 4:00–5:15 p.m. Pacific Time via Zoom.


This seminar is intended to help members learn about how their pension plan works, factors to consider when planning for retirement, and their pension options.

If your TQS application or card is delayed due to the postal strike, you must email HR-Teaching@sd43.bc.ca to let them know you're experiencing a delay.

In cases where the TQS has received an application and completed processing, they are emailing applicants with their updated category. If you've received that email, please forward it to HR-Teaching@sd43.bc.ca while you wait for the physical card. Payroll can process your category update or change, and you can upload your card at a later date. 
