

Kindergarten Literacy Screener

Meggan Crawford and Ronak Pahlevanlu met with Andrea Hunter to discuss the roll out of the K literacy screener. Teachers can use the literacy screener to inform reporting but are asked not to use the numerical outcome in their reporting. The classroom teacher should be the one assessing the student, however, LSTs can help with the rest of the class while the classroom teacher is administering the screener. We were also informed that if a student shows proficiency with one or multiple parts of the screener, those portions do not need to be completed again in May. The BCTF Representative Assembly was held in Victoria on November 7th and 8th. Lots of discussion I can't describe here, as it was in committee but, one thing that wasn't was an Executive Recommendation to give \$1,000,000 to The Alberta Teachers' Association to help in their legal fight against the use of the notwithstanding clause to force them back to work. We are very aware here how much it costs to fight in court to get a wrong righted against a government with bottomless pockets. Lots of teacher unions, and organizations across the country contributed to our fight. We hope the ATA will have the same success we had in 2016, when we got our Class Size and Composition language restored. A motion also passed to express public solidarity with the ATA, something the BCTF has already done. President Carole Gordon has already sent a strong letter to Premier Smith, as has the CTA.

Waiting for your TQS?

Whether you're a new hire or are changing your category, **you must submit your TQS card by November 30** to receive retroactive pay from
September 1. If your TQS application or card is delayed due to the postal strike, you must email HR-Teaching@sd43.bc.ca to let them know you're experiencing a delay.

In cases where the TQS has received an application and completed processing, they are emailing applicants with their updated category. If you've received that email, please forward it to HR-Teaching@sd43.bc.ca while you wait for the physical card. 1. Login, go to Copy screen. In the bottom right corner, press the APPLICATION button.



2. Select the button that shows 6 boxes in the middle of the screen.



3. Select the Bleed Removal button in the middle.



4. Select BLEED REMOVAL, choose the LIGHTEST setting and click OK.

Wednesday November 26, 7-10 pm, at the Parkside Brewery


The Tri-Cities Pride Society is holding a fundraiser so they can go into 2026 confident and ready for action!


