




President's Message




TTOC'S & New Teachers'

COMMITTEE FOR ACTION ON SOCIAL JUSTICE





The Respect at Work survey, led by the Canadian Labour Congress and researchers at Western University and the University of Toronto, is gathering workers' experiences with harassment and violence at work.

They want to hear from all workers aged 18+ who have worked in the past 12 months, whether or not you have experienced or witnessed harassment or violence at work. Participation is voluntary, confidential, and anonymous. The survey will take approximately 10–15 minutes to complete.



Prevent slips, trips, and falls on stairs



- Hold the handrail to help keep your balance.
- Keep your phone in your pocket to free up your hands and prevent distraction.



- Make sure you can see where you're going if you're carrying something.
- Where possible, use a cart or dolly and an elevator.



- Remove a slip and trip hazard if you can do it safely. If not, alert others and report the hazard.
- Avoid rushing, as it increases the risk of slips, trips, and falls.

You have the right to refuse unsafe work if there are uncontrolled slip and trip hazards in your workplace.
